



The homework grid below contains activities which link to our Superheroes topic for the Spring Term. Choose 1 task to do (you don't need to do them all) and complete it in your book or upload a photograph to Dojo by Thursday each week. Please date the square once completed. There will continue to be a weekly maths activity linked to what we have been learning that week. Please complete that in your homework book by Thursday each week. **One piece of homework is worth 2 Dojos but if you do both you will receive 5 dojos for being a homework superstar!** Your homework tasks are in addition to reading your school book as often as you can and practising your weekly spellings.

<p>In Science we are learning about Materials. Can you investigate which materials are waterproof? Test different materials such as paper, metal, cloth, plastic by dripping water on them.</p> <p>Extra activity - Can you make a house for a toy that will keep it dry? Be prepared to test it!</p> <p>Date Completed -</p>	<p>Look at an aerial view of our school area (you can use Google maps then press satellite). Can you see our school? Can you find your home? Show your adult how you get to school from your home using the map. Create a simple map to show your route to get to school from your home.</p> <p>Date Completed -</p>	<p>If you could have a super power what would it be? Would you be able to fly? Become invisible? See through buildings? Write about an adventure you might have.</p> <p>Date Completed -</p>	<p>Tell me about your own personal hero and why they are your hero. It may be a family member, a sports person, someone from the TV etc.</p> <p>You could write about them or draw a picture and label it.</p> <p>Date Completed -</p>
<p>Design a vehicle for a Superhero. It can be a villain you already know about or one you have made up. Don't forget to include a description of what they look like and what their crimes are.</p> <p>Date Completed -</p>

You could draw and label a picture or make a 3D model.</p> <p>Date Completed -</p>	<p>Take photographs or draw pictures of yourself being a 'superkid' at home. Maybe tidying your room or helping around the house.</p> <p>Date Completed -</p>	<p>Make a healthy hero snack or smoothie with a grown up. You can write your recipe and list of ingredients in your book and add a photo of you enjoying your hero snack on Dojo.</p> <p>Date Completed -</p>	<p>Try mixing the primary colours (red, yellow and blue) to see what other colours you can make.</p> <p>Date Completed -</p>

Can you find out about an explorer who went to the Arctic or Antarctica?</p> <p>Date Completed -</p>	<p>Design, draw and label your own Superhero. What will they be called? What will they wear? What special powers will they have?</p> <p>Date Completed -</p>	<p>Find out about a 'real life' Superhero from history using books or the internet. You may need to ask a grown up to help you access the internet.</p> <p>Date Completed -</p>
